ATTENTION ALL DOG OWNERS Dog Fouling Problem

Due to the high number of complaints received regarding the fouling of our footpaths by

irresponsible dog owners, the Association is again making representation to the Derry City Council with a view to law enforcement in this regard.

The Council states:- "These problems are caused by irresponsible dog owners who allow their pet to roam free and without supervision, allowing their pets to foul indiscriminately in our streets, parks and open spaces. Unfortunately there are also dog owners who walk their dogs and never clean up after them. Dog foul is a serious nuisance and a health hazard and every effort will be made by Council to enforce the law dog owners who allow their dogs to stray will be issued with a fixed penalty notice or will be taken to court where the maximum fine imposed is £200. In addition dog owners who walk their dogs and fail to clean up after their dog fouling will be issued with a £50 fixed penalty notice, while in court the maximum fine for dog fouling under the Litter (NI) Order 1994, is £500 ... The Council's dog wardens continue to patrol problem areas where dog straying and fouling is an issue; in particular our public walks and pathways.

We would appeal to all dog owners to act responsibly by controlling their animals and cleaning up after them when necessary.
