OUTLINE DEVELOPMENT PROPOSALS DESMOND'S & FAUGHAN VALLEY SCHOOL



We were delighted with the interest and response of the community to the initial proposals for the development of the Desmond's Site and Faughan Valley School Site. Many constructive comments were received and where concerns were expressed these have been forwarded to the appropriate authorities. The Desmond's Site proposals had almost unanimous support as these would provide essential employment in the area and give the community much needed facilities. Some concern was expressed regarding the housing development within the Faughan Valley School Site with the inclusion of apartment blocks being particularly criticised. However, the allocation of land to the Primary School for the development of sports and play facilities was universally welcomed as was the potential for the provision of a Community Centre facility.

This level of interest by the community has encouraged the Association to engage more meaningfully with the owners, planners and potential developers and this should provide the community with a strong voice when proposals are submitted for full planning permissions.

Meetings with owners, planners and political representatives are ongoing and we can report that, at this stage in the design process, the apartment blocks have been eliminated from the proposals and the terraced housing replaced with semi-detached houses.

It must be emphasised that the current proposals are not definitive and may change in the future but at least the residents of the area can be informed and to that end our website www.drumahoe.org will be updated as and when developments take place so please visit the website regularly.
