ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

During the recent snow falls a number of youths engaged in snowballing of traffic and the windows of houses. This is a serious and dangerous practice and we would appeal to all responsible parents to restrain young people from any form of anti-social behaviour. Belligerent behaviour such as window knocking, throwing eggs and littering do nothing for the image of the Village and indeed it is the cause of fear and anxiety to the elderly of the district.

LITTER BIN located at the Drumahoe Bridge

This bin is NOT to be used for domestic waste. This was provided so that bottles and cans etc could be kept from littering the banks of the River Faughan and is maintained by the DCA Committee, not by the Derry City Council. Residents should obviously use their own wheelie bins for domestic rubbish. For street litter we would encourage all residents to use the Litter Bins which have been provided by the Derry City Council.

MOTORBIKES

It has been observed that mini-motorbikes are on occasion driven around the area, sometimes on the footpaths and as these vehicles have no registration plates and the riders don't even have helmets it is an obvious danger not only to other road users and pedestrians but also to themselves. We would appeal to all road users to act in a responsible manner.

DANGEROUS PEDESTRIAN CROSSING!

We would urge all pedestrians to exercise extreme caution when using the <u>light controlled pedestrian crossing</u> in the centre of the village. We have had a number of reports of vehicles not stopping when the lights are red. It seems that traffic is now entering the village, from the Cityside, at a higher speed since the 40mph limit signs have been moved down to the Faughan Bridge. The Association will be making strong representation to the appropriate authorities regarding this matter.
